

Dumont Shade Tree Important Dates in 2020-2021

Check out the Dumont Shade Tree page in the Dumont Borough 2021 Calendar! Regular DSTC meetings are at 7:30pm: Third Monday of each month except for January and February which will be the second Monday. During the Health Emergency, Meetings will be held remotely via Zoom videoconference. The link to the meeting will be posted on the Dumont Shade Tree Commission Facebook page as well as the Dumont website. After the Health Emergency is over, we plan for meetings as stated on the Borough website, on the recycling calendar, and on the Commission website, dumontshadetree.org. The Commission is currently operating as per NJ and Dumont Borough guidelines: all face-to-face activities are suspended (tree inspections, hazard/permit issues). All non-essential activities have ceased. Emergency tree work will be coordinated through the DPW as per our emergency work policy.

From the President's Desk:

It is a natural paradox to find that the benefits you adore about an object, place, or experience, leads to some tasks and obligations you abhor. You love the autumn foliage, the changing leaves, the panoply of colors; but raking or gutter cleaning—not so much. You have to take the good with the bad, you'll say. You might even determine that raking leaves and maintaining your trees is too much of a burden. Cutting down a tree means you don't have to rake its leaves. You like trees, but just not THIS tree. You know that trees are nice for shade, you know that trees produce oxygen, but you wrongly assume that one tree here or there doesn't make a difference. It's an inconvenience, a burden. In the past eight months we have seen this misguided sentiment play out around the world in very alarming ways; sure the virus is bad, deadly even, but what about my convenience? What difference does it make if I don't wear a mask or follow the rules? What difference does one person make? Here's the thing; we have seen that we are not just one person, that the decisions we make as individuals have grave consequences far beyond our front yard. You may have heard people talk about personal liberties, but there is something just as important; personal responsibilities, personal obligations as a citizen, as a neighbor, as a resident of this planet. One person's choice and behavior DOES make a difference, one person's vote DOES make a difference. So does one tree. Every one.

Dumont Tree Ordinance:

In continuing the effort to protect the trees in our town, the Borough of Dumont has an amended Shade Tree ordinance; Ordinance 1503 6/21/16. By law, any resident must apply for a permit—\$25.00 fee —through the Building Department before ANY tree greater than 6 inches in caliper or 10 feet in height can be removed within the Borough of Dumont. This ordinance applies to trees on private property and to town trees. Following the application for a permit, the Dumont Shade Tree Commission will inspect the tree to certify the jurisdiction of the tree and determine if the tree is on private property and therefore can proceed. Failure to apply for a permit prior to removing a tree will result in a fine. Removing or damaging a borough tree will result in penalties. Our goal is to preserve the canopy in Dumont. The canopy protects all Dumont homes during winter and summer by providing shade and absorbing water. For further information on the ordinance contact the Dumont Building Department or the Shade Tree Commission.
